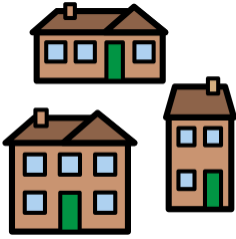
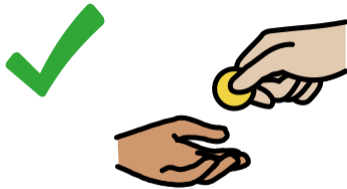


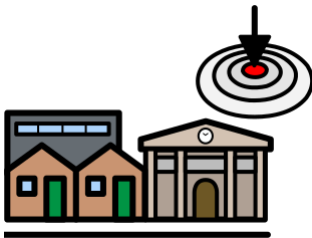
# What have Trafford Labour done so far?

We have made it easier for people who live in Partington to take part in sports.

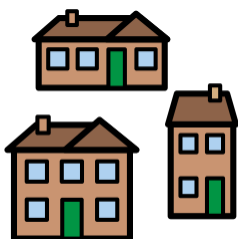


Trafford Labour have helped start many family hubs which help many parents and children get the help and support they need near their home.

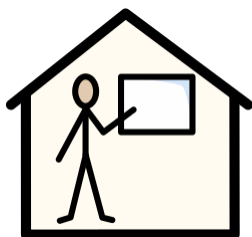


Trafford Labour have worked with groups to get 12 green flag parks which is an award a park gets for being well looked after.

# How will Trafford Labour make Trafford a better place to live and work?



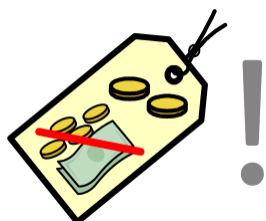
Trafford Labour wants even more homes for people to live in.



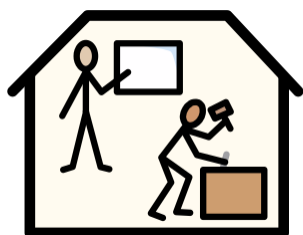
We have a plan on how it will work such as making sure there's plenty of spaces for children to go to school, better healthcare and places for children to play.



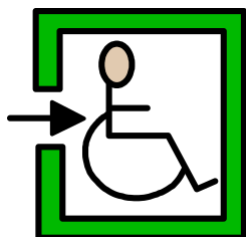
If we win, we would like to make Urmston town centre an even better place to visit.



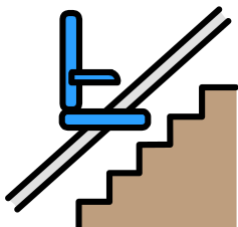
We will build even more homes that are cheaper and easier for families to pay for.



We will work with colleges to help the students get skilled and well paid jobs.

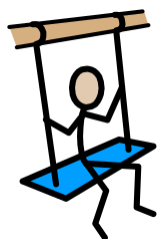


We will make sure all new home that are built are accessible or could easily be made accessible so people can still live in their own home even if they become older or disabled.

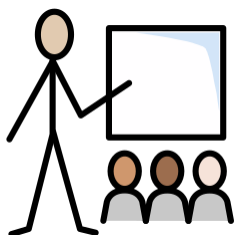


So for example all new homes will have to have a stair case wide enough to fit a stairlift in.

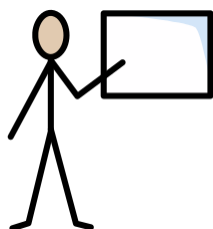
# How will Trafford Labour help children?



We will spend more money on parks so children have better play equipment to use.



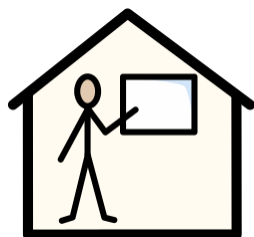
We will help mainstream schools have options for small specialist classes so disabled children can go to a school near their home easier.



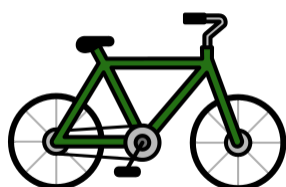
We will also make sure more teachers have better training to work with disabled children.



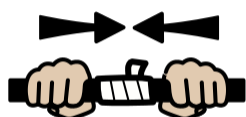
We will help stop people under 18 years old from vaping by taking away a shop's license if they sell vapes to people under 18 years old.

We will work with the renew hub so children can buy bikes for much less money.

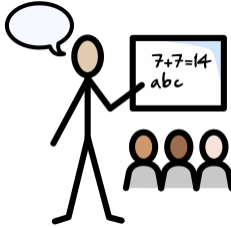


The renew hub saves items such as bikes from the tip and they fix them so they can be reused again.

We will also work with Tech4All to teach people how to use technology such as their phone or computer.

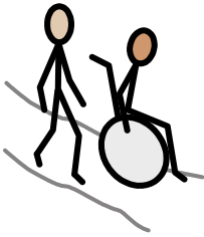


We will help people get a job or career by having more job clubs.

We will have more places to park your bike too.



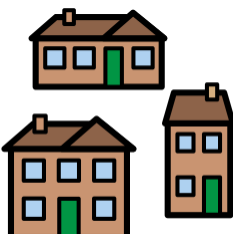
We will have more bike libraries so more people can use bikes.

We will continue to work with the bee network so bus prices are cheaper and elderly and disabled people can use their bus pass anytime.

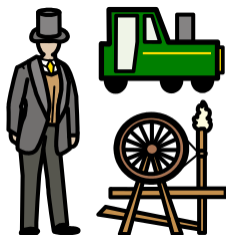


When new homes are built we will make sure there are still enough ways to get around and things to do.

We will look at ways to tell stories of our history and community.



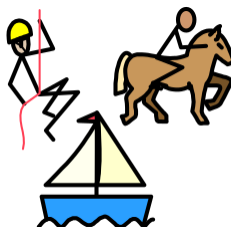
We will work more with Waterside Arts Centre.



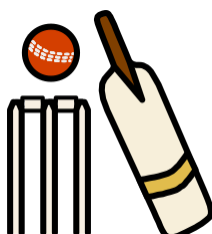
We will make Stretford and Sale leisure centre better.

# How will Trafford Labour help keep us safe?



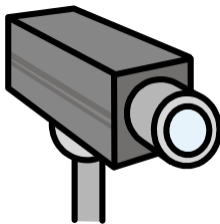
We will work with the Mayor of Manchester and the police so there is less burglary and crime in the area.



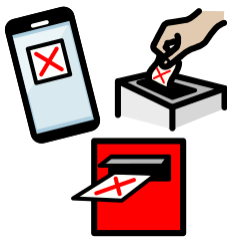
We will stop people using illegal electric bikes/scooters on the road.



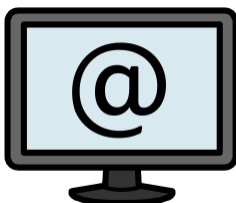
Electric bikes are not normally illegal unless they have been messed with so they go too fast which is dangerous.



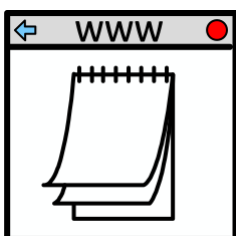
We will use cameras known as CCTV to catch and fine anyone leaving rubbish where they are not supposed to.
